- According to research by Forbes Advisor, Oklahoma City is one of the best places in the country for young adults to buy a home. OKC claimed the No.2 spot on the list, right behind Des Moines, Iowa.
- Researchers compiled the list after comparing the 100 most-populous metropolitan cities. They considered 10 metrics in four key categories: employment and pay, housing affordability, lifestyle and cost of living.
